

# Cook Islands Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Immigration Sponsor Application

Use this form if you are applying to sponsor a person to reside, visit, work or study in the Cook Islands.

To be a sponsor, you can be a natural person, a department or state-owned enterprise, island government, other government agency, or anybody that has a legal identity recognised under Cook Islands law and can be sued in their own right.

Natural person sponsors cannot be a sponsored person themselves at the same time as they act as a sponsor to another person.

Natural person sponsors can be persons with continuing rights or a person who holds a resident, work or investor permit currently residing in the Cook Islands.

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# Sponsor's responsibilities:

When you agree to be a sponsor, you undertake and agree to:

- make sure the sponsored person has financial support for maintenance for the duration of their stay (e.g. food, clothing, and health care) and
- make sure the sponsored person has suitable accommodation for the duration of their stay, and
- not enter into an agreement with any person for the reimbursement of costs incurred as a result of the sponsorship
- pay any amounts incurred as a debt to the Crown as a consequence of the sponsorship.

As a sponsor, you are responsible for the sponsored person from the day they arrive in the Cook Islands until the day they get a new visa and permit with a different sponsor or no sponsor, or the day they leave, whether they are on a valid permit or in the Cook Islands unlawfully.

### You must provide evidence:

- that you do not owe any debt to the Immigration Department, are not insolvent and have not been declared bankrupt
- that you have sufficient funds to pay for the maintenance of the sponsored person, and the sponsored person's accommodation for the duration of their stay in the Cook Islands\*

\*Note: If the sponsored person is providing some of the costs themselves, evidence of this must be included with their application and sponsorship form. If what they provide is not sufficient for their needs, you will be responsible for providing the rest of the costs.

### What happens if you do not honour your sponsorship?

- If you fail to carry out the responsibilities above, the sponsored person will be in breach of their permit conditions and may become liable for deportation.
- If the sponsored person incurs costs to the Cook Islands Government or a third party to cover any part of their maintenance, accommodation or travel, you will be responsible for repaying those costs.
- If you breach your sponsorship undertakings, you may be deemed ineligible to sponsor in the future.

  - (g) I acknowledge that information and documents are being collected, and further information and documents may be requested, with good reason, to:
    - (i) decide my application and determine my eligibility to be a sponsor; and
    - (ii) detect, prevent, investigate, prosecute, and respond to offences or suspected offences against the Cook Islands Immigration Act 2021 or other Acts; and
    - (iii) support the effective governance of the Cook Islands and to support the effective operation of other Government agencies; and
    - (iv) support the health and well-being of the Cook Islands and the Cook Islands' community (in particular to manage risks to public health, and the cost of, and demands on, the publicly funded health services):
  - (h) I agree that the sponsorship application information and documents can be shared with Government agencies in order to support the success, Cook Islands Immigration Regulations 2021 Schedule 3 43 safety, and security of the Cook Islands, including to manage risks to public health, and the cost of, and demands on, the publicly funded health services; and
  - (i) I agree that by making an application, Cook Islands Immigration can receive information, such as criminal records, health tests, and financial information from third parties. This includes information from the Ministries of Health, Justice, and Internal Affairs, the Cook Islands Customs Service, and the Police Service:
  - (j) I agree to advise the principal immigration officer of any change to information or material change in my circumstances during and after the application process that might affect me or my sponsorship:
  - (k) I acknowledge that if all the required information and documents are not provided, or the declaration is not signed, Cook Islands Immigration may be unable to decide the application. If this is the case, it will be declined:
  - (I) I agree, and acknowledge that if I do not acknowledge my sponsorship obligations:
    - (i) I can be sued for any money that I owe; and
    - (ii) I may be prevented from undertaking any further sponsorship; and
    - (iii) I cannot ask the person I sponsored to repay their debts to me for any costs I incur.

# About the information you provide

# Deciding whether you are eligible to be a sponsor

The information about you on this form is collected to determine your eligibility to be a sponsor of an applicant for temporary entry to the Cook Islands. The main recipient of the information is Cook Islands Immigration, but it may also be shared with other Government agencies, which are entitled to the information under applicable legislation. Collecting this information is authorised by the Cook Islands Immigration Act 2021 and the Cook Islands Immigration Regulations made under that Act. You do not have to provide the information, but if you do not then the sponsored person's visa and permit application may be declined. You are able to ask for the information we hold about you and have any of it corrected if you think it is necessary. The address of Immigration the Cook Islands is Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Immigration, Government Building, Avarua, Rarotonga the Cook Islands.

#### Health and disability services

Temporary visa and permit holders generally are not eligible for publicly funded health services. We strongly recommend that visitors, students and workers have comprehensive health insurance for the duration of their stay.
