About the information you provide

Deciding whether you are eligible for a visa

Cook Islands Immigration collects the information about you on this form to decide whether you are eligible for a spouse visa and permit. Collecting the information is authorised by the Cook Islands Immigration Act 2021 and the Cook Islands Immigration Regulations made under that Act. You do not have to provide the information, but if you do not, we are likely to decline your application.

Deciding whether you are eligible to board a flight to the Cook Islands

The information we collect may also be used to determine whether you are allowed to board a flight to the Cook Islands. We will not share your personal information with airline check-in agents; however, we will send a boarding message to the airline check-in agent based on the information you have provided in this form. Immigration the Cook Islands may also share the information you have provided with other government agencies that are entitled to it by law, or with other agencies (as you have agreed in the declaration). You are able to ask for the information we hold about you and have any of it corrected if you think it is necessary. The address of Immigration the Cook Islands is Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Immigration, Government Building, Avarua, Rarotonga, Cook Islands.

Other documents we may need

Sometimes we may ask for additional documents or information to consider with an application. You may wish to send other documents or information so that we can consider it with this application. Send photocopies only (not original documents), as these documents will not be returned to you.

If we need to see an original document, we will ask you to produce it later.
