Regulations

- Title**
These regulations are the Cook Islands Immigration Amendment Regulations 2024.
- Commencement**
These regulations come into force on the day after the date on which they are made.
- Principal regulations**
These regulations amend the Cook Islands Immigration Regulations 2023.

4. **New regulation 93A inserted (Fees for attendance of immigration officers and designated officers)**

After regulation 93, insert:

“93A Fees for attendance of immigration officers and designated officers

“(1) A person who requires an officer to attend to a matter outside of ordinary working hours must pay a fee.

“(2) The amount of the fee is as follows:

Day of attendance	Amount (\$) (inclusive of VAT)
Working day or Saturday	27.50 for every hour or part hour worked
Any other day	110.40, plus 36.80 for every hour or part hour worked after 3 hours

“(3) A person **requires an officer to attend to a matter** if,—

“(a) in the case of an attendance referred to in section 229A of the Act, the person is the carrier that is liable to pay the fee under that section:

“(b) in any other case, the person’s action requires the officer to attend in order to carry out the officer’s functions under the Act.

“(4) The principal immigration officer may, for a person or class of persons, waive or refund all or part of a fee prescribed by this regulation.

“(5) In this regulation,—

officer means an immigration officer or a designated officer

ordinary working hours means the hours between 8 am and 4 pm on a working day.”
